Michel Bonnier, Director of Public Health, bioMérieux

Michel Bonnier is the Director of Public Health for bioMérieux. This activity groups together all commercial operations with the government sector and NGOs worldwide. Before taking charge of public health, Mr. Bonnier occupied different functions within the company, including marketing and affiliate direction of the bioMérieux Group globally.

bioMérieux, specializing in the in vitro diagnostics sector, designs, develops, produces and markets diagnosis systems for medical or industrial applications.

Dr. Brian Brink, Senior Vice President, Health, Anglo American

Dr. Brian Brink advises Anglo American plc Group companies on the funding and delivery of health care benefits and on community health issues. He has been with the Anglo American Group for 25 years and is resident in South Africa. Dr. Brink has a special interest in the funding, delivery and management of health care services and strives to enhance the role of the private sector in broadening access to sustainable, quality healthcare – particularly in developing countries.

Dr. Brink has been actively involved in HIV/AIDS issues since the mid-1980's. With the rapid advance and increasing impact of the AIDS epidemic, these activities now take up the majority of his time. He is responsible for guiding Anglo American's response to the HIV/AIDS epidemic, both in the workplace and in communities associated with the company's operations. Anglo American Group companies sponsor one of the largest employer-based AIDS treatment programs in the world, with approximately 3000 employees currently receiving free antiretroviral therapy. The company has also invested in several community-based initiatives to prevent the further spread of HIV and to accelerate access to HIV/AIDS testing and treatment. On a broader scale, Dr. Brink is actively involved in addressing the particular challenge the HIV/AIDS epidemic poses to business in Southern Africa and internationally.

Dr. Brink is currently the alternate board member for the Private Sector Delegation on the Board of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB and Malaria. He is also a Board member of the International Women's Health Coalition and has an active interest in gender issues in relation to HIV and AIDS, particularly the extraordinary vulnerability of young women and girls to HIV infection. Dr. Brink is also a board member of Discovery Holdings Limited, the largest health insurer in Southern Africa.

Dr. Anatoly Chatokhine, Medical Advisor, BP

Dr. Chatokhine was born in 1959 and graduated as a medical doctor in 1982, specializing in anesthesiology. He worked in intensive care until 1999, then worked for International SOS Assistance / AEA Company, as a physician, from 1999 until 2003. He worked for the Sakhalin Energy Investment Company, as a medical adviser, from 2003 until 2005. Since 2005, he has served as occupational health adviser for Russia and Kazakhstan for BP.

Jenni Gillies, Group HIV Consultant, SABMiller plc

Jenni Gillies worked as a consultant to SAB Ltd for approximately 5 years and then joined the company on a permanent basis in 2002.

Dr. Bernard Luten, Head of Occupational Health and Global Issue Leader HIV/AIDS, Unilever NV

Dr. Luten currently serves as Head of Occupational Health and Global Issue Leader for HIV/AIDS at Unilever N.V., based in Rotterdam. Born in 1943 in the Netherlands, Dr. Luten previously served as Medical Director for KLM Royal Dutch Airlines from 1976 to 1994 and as ship physician for Holland America Cruises from 1972 to 1976. He has been with Unilever since 1994.

David McMurry, Manager, Administration, HIV/AIDS and Special Projects, Health & Medical Services Group, Chevron

A native of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, David McMurry studied communications at Southwestern Oklahoma State University, and, in 1973 joined an international public relations firm in Washington, DC. In 1979, he moved to San Francisco to work as a researcher for the Consumer Product Safety Commission. In 1982, he joined Chevron where he held various positions in Chevron Chemical Company's Public Affairs staff.

In 1990, he transferred to Chevron's corporate Public Affairs staff where he was in charge of the company's environmental contributions programs, the Chevron Conservation Awards Program, the Yosemite Volunteer Project and Chevron's Arts and HIV/AIDS funding.

He was named Senior Representative of the Public Relations Team in February, 1999, and Team Leader in December, 2000. Following the Chevron and Texaco merger, he served as the Corporate Identity and Advertising Production Manager. David later served as the Internal Events Coordinator prior to his current position. In 2005, he was appointed to manage the global implementation of Chevron's HIV/AIDS Policy. In his current position he manages HIV/AIDS Policy Sustainability, Special Projects such as the marketing and communications of Chevron's new

Cardiovascular Health Program, as well as strategic communications and strategy for Chevron's Health and Medical group.

McMurry is the past Vice Chair of Project Open Hand and Vice President of the Board of the East Bay Conservation Corps.

David Oxley, Corporate Vice President, Trinity Biotech

Dr. Michael Rabbow is responsible for HIV Policy and Public Affairs with the CD Communications Division at Boehringer Ingelheim. His responsibilities include HIV policy development, liaison to international and bilateral organisations and governments as well as the VIRAMUNE Donation Program for the prevention of mother-to-child transmission of HIV.

He has 22 years of work experience in the field of international health and was previously Head of the Health Care Division of SANIPLAN, a German consulting agency, and before that Senior Researcher at the Department of Tropical Hygiene and Public Health at Heidelberg University. From 1991 to 1998 he was Chief Medical Officer at the Directorate of Primary Health Care at the Ministry of Health and Social Services in Windhoek, Namibia.

He is a member of various NGOs and initiatives active in health-related issues. Michael's core skills and competencies include management of pharmaceutical initiatives and programs for HIV/AIDS, health strategy and policy development, multi-sectoral planning for HIV/AIDS control, communicable disease control programs, public-private partnerships and emergency health. He has lectured each year since 2005 on CSR and HIV/AIDS at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard, and on a regular basis to MBA/ EMBA groups at the Guanghua School.
